
The sleek and the strong

Anointing of the Sick is meant for baptized Catholics of all ages who seek the recovery of physical, mental, and spiritual health, those who are seriously impaired due to sickness, injury, or old age; those who are alienated from God and community because of physical or emotional disorders; those who have been wounded by evil, those who will be undergoing surgery.
