
Happening this weekend!

You're engaged and excited about getting married. Where
do you start? What's the process? Who should you call? Many
folks start by finding a place for the reception and then go
church shopping. Your first call should be to the church both to
make sure it is available and, more importantly, because your
wedding day is about entering a sacrament and only
secondarily a social event. Couples that are planning
marriage in the Catholic Church must give their parish priest
one full year's notice. To marry in St. Leo's parish you should
live within the parish boundaries and be formally registered
with the parish. Please note that no dates will be booked until
you have met with Fr. Frank.
