Following the tradition handed down from the Apostles, we gather in community to hear the Word of the Lord and to celebrate our communion with Christ in the banquet of his Body and Blood. Catholics that come to church and participate in the Mass bring themselves closer to Jesus and to the Communion of the Church.

Ten Commandments of Church Manners

1. Arrive on time for the Celebration of Mass.
2. Turn off cellular phones before entering the Church. Do not bring computer games to Church!
3. Do not chew gum in Church. (Communion Fast is one hour prior to receiving Communion.) This includes gum!
4. **GENUFLECT:** When entering the pew before Mass starts and exiting the pew after Mass has ended. Show respect for the blessed Eucharist present in the Tabernacle.
5. When children are restless, take them to the lobby or to the back of the Church.
6. "Look" to where the action is on the Altar – priest, readers etc.
7. Sing and pray with **ENTHUSIASM!**
8. When receiving Holy Communion, consume the host immediately – do not walk away with it.
9. Remain in your pew until the final procession reaches the back of the Church.
10. After Mass is completed, say a prayer.

Promote accessibility when you are in Church

Please pay attention and look out for parishioners that have limited mobility and for frail seniors when you are in Church; make sure that parishioners with disability have a suitable seat and have easy access in and out of the pews, when you go up and down the aisles for Holy Communion, give people with physical limitation plenty of space so they can move around and have something to hold on to without having to try to avoid you in the process. Let's all be aware of our parishioners who are physically challenged.

The Breaking of the bread

Luke's gospel describes an appearance of the risen Jesus to two disciples who are on their way to Emmaus (EM-mouse). This place is usually



Jesus was made known in the breaking of bread identified with the Arab village of Amwas. It is set on a mountain overlooking the Mediterranean. He talks with them, but they do not recognize him. This may be caused by their grief or the spectacular sunset over the Mediterranean. It is not until he sits down in their home and "breaks bread" that they come to understand who he is. Of course, we immediately see the connection with the Eucharist, but there also may be something more. There were no utensils at a 1st century Jewish meal, except perhaps a knife. People ate with flat bread similar to today's Syrian or Pita bread. It came in large sheets. The host would tear off a section of the bread and use it to pick up the food. He would then pass the bread to the others at the table. Each would take a section. By the time it reached the last place, there was often little or none left. Jesus may have had a different way of breaking bread. He did not take his share first, thus making himself last. This set an example of humility for the others. It certainly would have been unusual -- and recognizable. (Lonsdale Commentaries & Clip-Art)
