
Graduates

Touch His Clothes

While Jesus is going to Jairus' home a woman walks behind him in the crowd. She has been ill for a dozen years and thinks, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Then she touches Jesus' cloak.



This article of clothing is probably his "tallith" or prayer shawl. It is worn by every Orthodox Jew during prayer. It is traditionally a long sheet of cloth with tassels on each corner. It is a miniature of the Meeting Tent where Moses worshipped. In a sense it is a private "church" where one can retreat into prayer. The woman came into contact with the church of Jesus and gained healing. (Note the parallel between "tallith" [prayer shawl] and "talitha" [Jesus' word]) (Lonsdale Commentaries & Clip-Art)

Attention Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers






Nutrition Coordinator Wanted

St. Louis Catholic School is looking for a Student Nutrition Program coordinator for the 2018-2019 academic year!

Hours: Mornings

- Days per Week: Monday to Friday
