

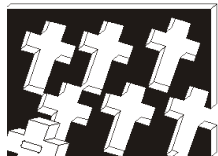

New Missal

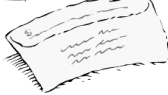

Christmas Fruit Cakes

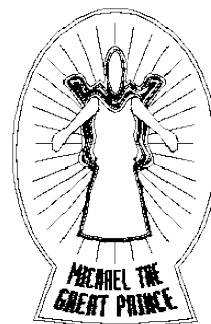

Michael the Great Prince

During November the Church asks us to think about the ultimate fate of our lives, what are called the "Last things". This refers to what happens after we die, and includes thoughts of hell, purgatory and heaven. In particular, we are asked to think about the Last Judgment. On odd-numbered years we read selections from the last book of the bible, Revelation also known as the Apocalypse. This year we turn to the book of Daniel which has a similar section. The prophet has a dream or vision of heaven and the court of God. The Archangel Michael is the commander of God's angel army. This passage is the oldest description of the resurrection of the dead.
