### Like a Libation

The second letter to Timothy describes a trial against Paul, probably in Rome. He fully expects a death sentence and is resigned to it. He interprets it as a sacrifice, indicating this by his choice of the word "libation". There were many varieties of offerings made to gods. There were sacrifices of animals, plants and also liquids like wine and oil. Fluid sacrifices were called libations. (Lonsdale Commentaries & Clip-Art)




### Parish Headcount

### History of All Saints Day

All Saints Day is a very old feast. It arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom.



When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown were properly honored. The current date of November 1 was instituted by Pope Gregory III (731-741), when he consecrated a chapel to all the martyrs in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and ordered an annual celebration. This celebration was originally confined to the diocese of Rome, but Pope Gregory IV (827-844) extended the feast to the entire Church. The vigil or eve of the feast, October 31, is commonly known as All Hallows Eve, or [Halloween](#). The day after All Saints day is All Soul's Day, a day to memorize and offer prayers on behalf of all of the truthful departed. In many civilizations these two days share many customs.
