

What to do at the Time of Death

The circumstances that surround the loss of a loved one and the planning for funeral services may vary widely. Nevertheless, the arrangements typically follow this pattern in whole or in part. When death has occurred, the family notifies the funeral home they have selected. The family meets with the funeral home staff to make arrangements. The funeral home contacts the Parish and the process of preparing for the funeral begins. The funeral home confirms dates and times for services which typically include:

- A vigil service at the funeral home;
- the funeral liturgy;
- the committal service at the cemetery.

The Parish will provide an organist and cantor for the funeral Mass or other service in church. St. Leo’s Parish is glad to be of service at this difficult time and will try to accommodate the needs and wishes of the family.
