Booking Mass Intentions


Catholics traditionally offer Masses for those who have died and for other special intentions. You may book a Mass by visiting or calling the parish office, Monday to Friday, during office hours. Announced Masses are listed in the weekly bulletin and mentioned at Mass. The stipend is \$20 per Mass. Unannounced Masses will be celebrated without public mention as soon as possible. The stipend is \$10 per Mass. Mass Cards are also available.

Fallen asleep

Paul is teaching about the resurrection. Some of the people of Thessalonica expected the Second Coming of Christ to happen in the immediate future. They also anticipated that they would ascend to heaven with him. But some believers had died. This led survivors to fear that the dead wouldn't share in Jesus' triumph. Paul answers that the dead Christians hadn't really died; they had merely entered a sleep-like state pending the resurrection.
